This is a very important point: God makes it clear that the abominations above are not simply a law unto Israel, but a law that God holds all people accountable for. These are laws of nature that are not to be violated. While no man is any more under the law of Moses, this chapter indicates that these laws concerning sexual relations transcend the law of Moses. Therefore, they are still wickedness in the eyes of God today.
